IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 52 of the Electricity Act, the Malawi Energy Regulatory Authority makes the following By-laws--

Citation	1. These By-laws may be cited as the Electricity (Amendment) By-laws, 2018.
Amendment of by-law 2 to Cap.70:01 sub. leg. p.27	2. The Electricity By-laws (hereinafter referred to as the "principal By-laws") are amended, in By-law 2, by inserting, in the correct alphabetical order, the following new definitions—
Cap 30:12	"NCHE" means the National Council for Higher Education established under section 3 of the National Council for Higher Education Act;
Cap 53:05	"NCIC" means the National Construction Industry Council established under section 3 of the National Construction Industry Act; and
	"TEVETA" means the Technical, Entrepreneurial Vocation Education and Training Authority established under section 4 of the Technical,

Entrepreneurial Vocation Education and Training Act;".

3. By-law 8 (2) of the principal By-laws is revoked and replaced as follows-

"(2) The Committee shall consist of the following members-

(a) two persons representing the Authority who shall be Chairperson and Secretary respectively;

(b) one person representing the holders of a distribution and supply licences;

(c) one qualified and practicing electrical engineer appointed by the Board of Engineers;

(d) one person representing NCIC;

(e) one person representing the renewable testing and training centre for renewable energies;

(f) one person representing TEVETA; and

(g) one person representing a faculty of electrical engineering from an accredited institution of higher learning.".

4. By-law 12 of the principal By-laws is revoked and replaced with the following new By-law 12—

"Technical qualifications "12—(1) A person shall not be considered for a permit under these By-laws, unless he possesses any of the following technical qualifications—

(a) a University Degree in the relevant field of study from any institution accredited by the NCHE;

(b) a University Diploma in the relevant field of study from any institution accredited by NCHE;

(c) a Technician's Diploma in the relevant field of study from any institution accredited by TEVETA;

(d) a City and Guilds Diploma accredited by TEVETA;

(e) TEVETA qualifications of a minimum level of 3:

(f) a Degree, Diploma or Certificate from university or institution in the relevant field of renewable energy technologies accredited by NCHE; or

(g) any other technical qualification recognized by NCHE or TEVETA.

(2) In addition to the qualification under paragraph (1), the Committee may consider the relevant practical experience in order to determine the class of permit to issue to an applicant.

(3) An applicant with foreign qualifications shall be responsible for the accreditation or recognition of his or her qualifications with NCHE or TEVETA.".

Amendment of by-law 12 of the principal By-laws

Amendment of By-law 8(2) of the principal By-laws Amendment of by-law 13(1) of the principal By-laws 5. By-law 13 (1) of the principal By-laws is revoked and replaced as follows-

"(1) The Committee may, subject to such conditions as it may impose, issue any of the following types of permit-

(a) CLASS A for carrying out installation works at all voltage levels;

(b) CLASS A-1 for carrying out high voltage line installation works of 33,000 V and above;

(c) CLASS A-2 for carrying out industrial electrical wiring installations of 33,000 V and above;

(d) CLASS B-1 for carrying out high voltage line installation works of up to 33,000V;

(e) CLASS B-2 for carrying out industrial electrical wiring installations of up to 33,000 V;

(f) CLASS C for carrying out overhead and underground medium voltage installations of up to 400 V including—

(i) installations in multi-storied building and other big buildings of complex design and commercial buildings; or

(ii) installations of light plants of up to a level of 400 V;

(g) CLASS D for carrying out electrical wiring installations of up to 400V;

(h) CLASS E for installations of 3 phase grid connected renewable energy mini grid systems;

(*i*) CLASS E-1 for installations of 3 phase off-grid renewable energy mini grid systems;

(*j*) CLASS E-2 for installations of 3 phase stand-alone renewable energy generation and supply systems; and

(k) CLASS F for installations of 1 phase stand-alone renewable energy generation and supply systems.".

6. By-law 89 of the principal By-laws is amended, by inserting the following new paragraphs—

"(3) A person shall not practice as an inspector of electrical installations under this By-law, unless he is in possession of an Inspection Certificate issued by the Authority.

(4) A person who intends to practice as an inspector of electrical installations shall apply to the Authority in the form as prescribed in Second Schedule hereto and upon payment of a prescribed fee.

(5) Upon receiving an application referred to under paragraph (4), the Authority, through the Committee, shall assess the application and shall, when satisfied with the application, issue an Inspection Certificate to the applicant.

Amendment of by-law 89 to the principal By-laws

(6) A person who has been issued with an Inspection Certificate under this by-law shall, within seven days of receipt of that certificate, surrender his installer's permit to the Authority.

7. By-law 160 (1) of the principal by-laws is amended, by inserting a new paragraph (h), as follows—

"(h) the applicant's electrical installation works have been undertaken by a person without a permit issued by the Authority and the installation works have not been certified by a person with a valid permit issued by the Authority in accordance with by-law 27(2) and (3)."
