ORDER

This Court is not impressed with the work of the investigators for this case. It was to say one least sub-standard work. Why did they arrest the accused when

there was nothing connecting him to the offence? Or have they deliberately withheld the evidence to avoid the culprits from being brought to book?

It is clear from the facts that the deceased was killed by a mob. If the police do not properly investigate such matters and pin the culprits, how shall we discourage the anomaly that comes along with mob justice?

Word must go to the Officer-In-Charge at Rumphi Police Station to look into this seriously. They are responsible for keeping law and order in the district and they must not allow mob justice to prevail. Sometimes it prevails because people are not satisfied with their work as it has happened in this manner.

This was homicide case. How casually then would they handle less serious cases than homicide.

The facts as shown by the evidence do not connect the accused to the offence. He is therefore found not guilty and is acquitted accordingly.
